FROM THE PRESIDENT – Shobita DuBois

We all recognize what a pink ribbon represents. October has come to be known as Breast Cancer Awareness Month. But, did you know that the first ribbon that called attention to breast cancer research wasn't pink? In fact, it was peach!

Charlotte Haley lived in Simi Valley, California, outside of Los Angeles. In the 1980s, Charlotte's sister and daughter were diagnosed with breast cancer during a time when not many people talked about it. It was more of a "whisper behind closed doors" type of disease. Charlotte was determined to change that and encourage legislators to increase funding for breast cancer research. She decided to make ribbons to draw attention to the disease – peach ribbons. Peach was Charlotte's favorite color. She started pinning peach ribbons on cards that said, "The National Cancer Institute annual budget is \$1.8 billion, only 5 percent goes for cancer prevention. Help us to wake up our legislators and America by wearing this ribbon." Charlotte handed these out everywhere, sent them to First Ladies and Dear Abby, and even mailed them overseas to gain a more global awareness.

In the early 1990s, *Self Magazine* approached Charlotte and asked her if they could use her ribbon to expand the movement. However, Charlotte didn't want big businesses to commercialize the concept only to profit from the cause. She refused. It was in 1992 that the editor of *Self Magazine*, Alexandra Penney, changed the color of the ribbon to pink. After teaming up with Estee Lauder, *Self Magazine* launched the breast cancer awareness campaign in its October, 1992 edition. Estee Lauder make-up counters handed out approximately 1.5 million ribbons with a card describing a proper breast self-exam and collected over 200,000 pink ribbon petitions that called for legislators to increase research funding. Meanwhile, The Susan G. Komen Foundation had already started using the color pink as its Foundation's color. In 1991, the Foundation handed out pink ribbons at its Race for the Cure.

Whether you attribute the origin of the pink ribbon to Charlotte, Alexandra Penney or The Susan G. Komen Foundation, the fact remains that breast cancer research is squarely on the map today. There is no longer a stigma attached to breast cancer, and survival rates are better than they have ever been in large part because of research efforts. So, wear peach or pink this month to show your support for breast cancer awareness.
